RE: Approval of a Lead Services Contract between Genesee County Planning Commission and Environmental Testing and Consulting (ETC) to provide lead inspections, risk assessments, clearances, and asbestos testing for rehabilitation programs

BOARD ACTION REQUESTED:

Staff are requesting approval for Genesee County to enter into a contract with Environmental Testing and Consulting (ETC) to provide lead inspections, risk assessments, clearances, and asbestos testing for the rehabilitation programs administered by the Planning Commission and for Commissioner Avery to sign the contract. (GL accounts 2340-731.00-866.239, 2336-731.00-866.239, and 2360-731.01-866.239).

BACKGROUND:

Lead inspections and clearances are completed on each homeowner property (built prior to 1978) under the Home Improvement Program, as well as any property acquired under the Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP) and Neighborhood Purchase Rehabilitate Resale Program (NPRR).

DISCUSSION:

A Request for Proposals (RFP) was released through the Genesee County Purchasing Department for lead inspections, risk assessments, clearances, and asbestos testing. Five proposals were received and scored by three staff members. Environmental Testing and Consulting (ETC) received the highest average score and also submitted the lowest fee scale.

IMPACT ON HUMAN RESOURCES:

There will be no impact on Human Resources.

IMPACT ON BUDGET:

CDBG, CDBG-CV and HOME funding is in the current budget.

IMPACT ON FACILITIES:

There will be no impact on Facilities.

IMPACT ON TECHNOLOGY:

There will be no impact on Technology.

CONFORMITY TO COUNTY PRIORITIES:

Providing lead inspections, risk assessments, clearances, and asbestos testing falls in line with Genesee County's priority of creating healthy, livable, and safe communities. The majority of homes that receive assistance through the Genesee County Home Improvement Program were built prior to 1978, and the lead inspections and risk assessments are critical to discovering and removing lead hazards.

TO THE HONORABLE CHAIRPERSON AND MEMBERS OF THE GENESEE COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS, GENESEE COUNTY, MICHIGAN

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN:

BE IT RESOLVED, by this Board of County Commissioners of Genesee County, Michigan, that the request by the Director of Planning to authorize entering into a contract between Genesee County and Environmental Testing and Consulting (ETC), whereby Environmental Testing and Consulting (ETC) will perform lead testing and inspections, as needed, on homes to be rehabilitated through the Genesee County Home Improvement Program (HIP), Neighborhood Stabilization Program (NSP), and Neighborhood Purchase Rehabilitate Resale Program (NPRR), for the term commencing November 20, 2024, through November 19, 2025, with the cost of testing and inspections to be determined based on need and billed to the following account numbers: CDBG HIP 2340-731.00-866.239, CDBG-CV 2336-731.00-866.239, and HOME HIP 2360-731.01-866.239, is approved (a copy of the memorandum request and supporting documents being on file with the official records of the November 13, 2024 meeting of the Community and Economic Development Committee of this Board), and the Chairperson of this Board is authorized to execute the Contract on behalf of Genesee County.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This Contract for Professional Services (the “Contract”) is by and between the County of Genesee, a Michigan Municipal Corporation, whose principal place of business is located at 1101 Beach Street, Flint, Michigan 48502 (the “County”), and **Environmental Testing and Consulting, Inc. (ETC), a Michigan Corporation**, whose principal place of business is located at **38900 Huron River Drive, Romulus, MI 48174** (the “Contractor”) (the County and the Contractor together, the “Parties”).

1. Term

1.1 Initial Term

The initial term of this Contract commences on **November 20, 2024** and shall be effective through **November 19, 2025** (the “Initial Term”).

1.2 Extension Terms

The Board has the option to extend this Agreement for up to four (4) one-year terms (the “Extension Terms”).

2. Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to perform the services described on Exhibit A (the “Services”).

3. Compensation

The Contractor shall be paid according to the rates identified on Exhibit A. The Contractor must provide to the County monthly invoices in a form acceptable to the County, along with any necessary supporting documentation such as time sheets. The County will pay the Contractor within sixty (60) days of the County’s acceptance of the invoice and supporting documentation.

4. Taxes.

The County is a Michigan Municipal Corporation. The Contractor acknowledges that the County is exempt from Federal Excise Tax and Michigan Sales Tax.

5. Contract Administrator

The contract administrator for this Contract is **Nichole Odette** (the “Contract Administrator”). The Contractor acknowledges that the Contract Administrator is the primary County contact for notices and instructions related to this Contract. The Contractor agrees to provide a copy of all notices related to this Contract to the Contract Administrator.

6. Warranties

The Contractor warrants that:

- 6.1 The Services will be performed in a good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with generally acceptable practices in the industry.
- 6.2 The Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws in the performance of the Services.
- 6.3 The Contractor will comply with the requirements of any federal or state grants used to fund or support this Contract.
- 6.4 The Contractor will obtain and maintain all applicable licenses and permits necessary to provide the Services for the entire term of this Contract.
- 6.5 The Contractor will obtain and maintain all applicable licenses and permits necessary to provide the Services for the entire term of this Contract.

The Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its officials, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, damages, or liability, including defense costs, arising out of the Contractor's breach of these warranties.

7. Suspension of Work

7.1 Order to Suspend Performance

Upon written order of the Contract Administrator, the Contractor agrees to immediately suspend performance of the Services. The Contractor shall not be entitled to compensation for any Services performed during any period in which the Contract Administrator has directed that the Services be suspended.

7.2 Necessary Actions Before Suspension

If immediate suspension of the Services would cause harm, injury, or damage to persons or property, the Contractor must immediately notify the Contract Administrator of the nature of such harm, injury, or damage, and obtain written authorization from the Contract Administrator to take such necessary action as to prevent or minimize such harm, injury or damage. Actions authorized by the Contract Administrator pursuant to this paragraph are compensable.

8. Termination

8.1 Termination for Cause

If the Contractor is in breach of any provision of this Contract, and such breach continues for fourteen (14) days after written notice is issued to the Contractor by the County of the breach, the County may terminate this Contract. Such termination for cause is effective upon receipt of the notice of termination by the Contractor.

In addition to any other remedies provided by law or this Contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the County as a result of the Contractor's breach and termination, including any costs to obtain substitute performance.

8.2 Immediate Termination

If the County, in its discretion, determines that the Contractor's breach of this Contract constitutes a threat to public health, safety, or welfare, the County may terminate this Contract immediately upon notice to the Contractor.

In addition to any other remedies provided by law or this Contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the County as a result of the Contractor's breach and termination, including any costs to obtain substitute performance.

8.3 Termination for Convenience

If the County determines that it is in the County's best interests, the County may terminate this Contract upon thirty (30) days written notice to the Contractor.

The County shall pay for all work properly performed up to the effective date of the notice of termination.

8.4 Termination for Lack of Funding

If this Contract is funded by public funds or a grant from a public or private entity, and the funds are not appropriated or the grant is discontinued, the County may terminate this Contract by written notice specifying the date of termination.

The County shall pay for all work properly performed up to the effective date of the notice of termination.

9. Nondiscrimination

The Contractor covenants that it will not discriminate against an employee or applicant of employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, sexual identity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, height, weight, marital status or a disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position, and that it will require the same non-discrimination assurances from any subcontractor who may be used to carry out duties described in this contract. Contractor covenants that it will not discriminate against businesses that are owned by women, minorities or persons with disabilities in providing services covered by this Contract, and that it shall require the same assurances from subcontractors. Breach of this covenant shall be regarded as a material breach of this contract.

10. Freedom of Information Act

This Contract and all attachments, as well as any other information submitted by the Contractor to the County, are subject to disclosure under the provisions of MCL 15.231, et seq., known as the "Freedom of Information Act".

11. Intellectual Property

Any intellectual property created by the Contractor in the performance of the Services shall be considered a work made for hire, and any and all rights in such intellectual property shall belong solely to the County. Upon the County's request, the Contractor agrees to execute any documents necessary to convey ownership of such intellectual property to the County.

12. Audit Rights

12.1 Certification of Accurate Information

Contractor certifies that all information provided to the County by the Contractor relating to the award or modification of this Contract, or any payment or dispute related to this Contract, is true and correct. The Contractor further certifies that its accounting system conforms to generally accepted accounting principles.

12.2 Inspection

The Contractor agrees that the County may inspect the Contractor's plant, place of business, or worksite to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract. If this Contract is funded or supported with any state or federal grant funds, the state or federal agencies responsible for administering the applicable grants may examine the Contractor's plant, place of business, or worksite to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract and the terms of the applicable grant.

12.3 Audit

The Contractor agrees that the County may examine the Contractor's records to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract. If this Contract is funded or supported with any state or federal grant funds, the state or federal agencies responsible for administering the applicable grants may examine the Contractor's records to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract and the terms of the applicable grant.

12.4 Records Retention

The Contractor agrees to maintain any business records related to this Contract or the Contractor's performance under this Contract for a period of at least three (3) years after final payment.

13. Identity Theft Prevention

13.1 In the event that the Contractor will obtain identifying information during the performance of the Services, the Contractor must take reasonable precautions to ensure that such identifying information is protected from unauthorized disclosure and is used only for the purpose of performing the Services.

13.2 For the purposes of this Paragraph, “identifying information” means any name or number that may be used, alone or in conjunction with any other information, to identify a specific person, including but not limited to name, address, telephone number, social security number, date of birth, driver’s license number, taxpayer identification number, or routing code.

14. Insurance Requirements and Indemnification

The Contractor shall at all times maintain in full force and effect for duration of the term of this agreement the following insurance coverages. All coverage shall be with insurance companies licensed and admitted to do business in the State of Michigan, having an AM Best rating of at least A- and acceptable to Genesee County. In addition, the County reserves the right to modify or waive at any time any applicable insurance requirements based on the scope of services provided at the discretion of the County’s Risk Manager or other authorized representative of the County.

Commercial General Liability Insurance on an “occurrence basis” with minimum limits of \$1,000,000 per occurrence and a \$2,000,000 aggregate limit.-. The policy shall name Genesee County, including all employees, elected and appointed officials and volunteers, all boards, commissions, and/or authorities, and their board members, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds. Coverage shall be primary and non-contributory, including a waiver of subrogation in favor of the County.

Workers’ Compensation Insurance – as required by and in accordance with all applicable statutes of the State of Michigan, including Employers’ Liability Coverage.

Automobile Liability – Including Michigan No-Fault coverages, with limits of liability not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. Coverage shall include all owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles. Limits may be satisfied using primary and excess/umbrella liability policies. -. The policy shall name Genesee County, including all employees, elected and appointed officials and volunteers, all boards, commissions, and/or authorities, and their board members, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds.

Professional Liability Insurance – in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate. If this policy is a claims made form, the Contractor shall be required to keep said policy in force, or purchase “tail” coverage for a minimum of three (3) years after the termination of this contract.

Cyber Liability Insurance – in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$2,000,000 aggregate including, data breach response, network security liability and business interruption. Coverage should be primary and non-contributory, name Genesee County as additional insured. Including legal and regulatory compliance.

A licensee or its insurance broker shall notify the County of any cancellation or reduction in coverage within seven (7) days of receipt of insurer's notification to that effect. The

contractor, licensee, permittee, or lessee shall forthwith obtain and submit proof of substitute insurance to the County Risk Manager within five (5) business days in the event of expiration or cancellation of coverage.

14.1 Insurance Certificate and Additional Insured Coverage

- 1. Certificate of Insurance** – The contractor must provide a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the required insurance set forth above. The Certificate Holder should be listed as follows:

- 2. Endorsements** In addition, the contractor must provide the following endorsements, including but not limited to:

- a. An additional insured endorsement (equivalent in coverage to ISO form CG 20 10 and CG 20 37) naming the "Genesee County, its officials, employees and agents, all boards, commissions and/or authorities and board members, including employees and volunteers thereof" as additional insureds under the general liability policy. No person or department should be identified as the additional insured. Coverage afforded shall be considered primary and any other insurance or self-insurance, maintained by or available to the County shall be considered secondary and/or excess.
- b. An endorsement to each policy stating that such policy shall not be cancelled or reduced in coverage except after thirty (30) days prior written notice to County. Cancellation, material restriction, nonrenewal or lapse of any of the required policies shall be grounds for immediate termination of the Agreement by the County. If any of the required coverages expire during the term of the contract, the vendor shall deliver renewal certificates, endorsements, and/or policies to County at least ten (10) days prior to the expiration date.

In lieu of required endorsements, a copy of the policy sections, where coverage is provided for additional insured and cancellation notice, may be acceptable. Copies of all policies mentioned above shall be furnished, if so requested.

14.2 Indemnification

The Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold harmless the County, its officials, officers, agents, and employees from any and all claims, damages, or liability, including defense costs, arising out of the Contractor's performance of the Services or presence on the County's property or worksite. Contractor agrees that the insurance requirements specified in the contract do not reduce the liability Contractor has assumed in the indemnification/hold harmless section of the Contract.

15. Independent Contractor

The Contractor and its agents and employees are independent contractors and are not the employees of the County.

16. General Provisions

16.1 Entire Contract

This Contract, consisting of the following documents and Exhibits, embodies the entire Contract between the Parties.

16.1.1. The Contract – This Professional Services Contract

16.1.2. Exhibit A – The Scope of Work

There are no promises, terms, conditions, or obligations relating to the Services other than those contained herein. In the event of a conflict between this Contract and any Exhibit, the terms of this Contract shall control.

16.2 No Assignment

The Contractor may not assign or subcontract this Contract without the express written consent of the County.

16.3 Modification

This Contract may be modified only in writing executed with the same formalities as this Contract.

16.4 Binding Effect

The provisions of this Contract shall apply to and bind the heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns all of the parties hereto.

16.5 Headings

The paragraph headings in this Contract are used only for ease of reference, and do not limit, modify, construe, and or interpret any provision of this Contract.

16.6 Governing Law and Venue

This Contract is entered into under the laws of the State of Michigan. Any litigation between the Parties arising out of this Contract must be initiated within two years of the cause of action accruing and must be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction in Genesee County, Michigan.

16.7 Subpoena Power

The Contractor acknowledges and understands that the Chairperson of the Genesee County Board of Commissioners, pursuant to MCL 46.3(5), as amended, has the power to administer oaths, issue subpoenas, and compel a person's attendance in the same manner as a court of law. The Contractor agrees to submit to this power with respect to this Contract.

16.8 Severability and Survival

In the event that any provision of this Contract is deemed by any court of competent jurisdiction to be legally ineffective, such decision shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Contract.

16.9 Interpretation

Each Party has had opportunity to have this Contract reviewed by legal counsel and has had equal opportunity to contribute to its contents. In the event of any dispute concerning the interpretation of this Contract, there shall be no presumption in favor of any interpretation solely because the form of this Contract was prepared by the County.

16.10 Remedies

All remedies specified in this Contract are non-exclusive. The County reserves the right to seek any and all remedies available under this Contract and applicable law in the event that the Contractor fails to abide by the terms of this Contract.

EXHIBIT A

Scope of Work

The lead and asbestos inspection services anticipated to be provided are grouped into the broad categories listed below:

- A. Inspections: Inspections for lead-based paint, as stated in federal regulations 24 CFR Part 35.1320(a), shall be performed in accordance with the methods and standards established by the State of Michigan or those standards set forth by the EPA at 40 CFR 745.227(b), whichever is more stringent shall apply (See F. for report requirements)
- B. Risk Assessments: Risk Assessments for lead-based paint hazards, as stated in federal regulations 24 CFR Part 35.1320 (b), shall be performed in accordance with the methods and standards established by the State of Michigan or those standards set forth by the EPA at 40 CFR 745.227(d), whichever is more stringent shall apply. In addition, the standards set forth in federal regulations at 24 CFR Part 35.1320(b)(1)(2) shall also apply (See F for report requirements)
- C. Clearance Examinations: Issue clearance findings at completion of rehabilitation where lead-based paint is found and may be disturbed by rehabilitation activities. Final clearance examinations shall be performed by a certified person in accordance with the current Department of Housing and Urban Development and State of Michigan standards.
- D. The lead inspector is to perform a lead inspection which tests all painted surfaces inside and outside the home; and, including all accessory structures and equipment (e.g. garages, sheds, fences, swing sets, etc.) to determine if lead is present. A report shall list the areas tested and whether lead was found. The risk assessor performs tests for the presence of lead-based paint hazards to children which can be in the form of paint, house dust, and soil. A report shall indicate the location of the types of lead hazards and ways to remove them.

Both lead inspector/risk assessor shall be knowledgeable of: 1) Part II, Department of Housing & Urban Development 24 CFR, Part 35, E.A. (9/15/99); 2) the Lead Abatement Act of 1998, Sections 333.5453 to 333.5460 of the Michigan Compiled Laws; 3) Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) Certifications, Regulations, and Work Practices; Title IV of the Toxic Substances Control Act (TSCA 15 U.S.C. 2681-2692; 4) Rule 325.51991 of the Michigan Occupational Safety and Health Administration (MIOSHA); 5) Michigan Department of Environmental Quality Hazardous Waste Act 64; 6) Nuclear Regulatory Commission (XRF radiation sources); 7) and all other federal, state, and local regulations, if applicable.

- E. Asbestos Containing Materials Assessment: The inspections shall be

performed and include the conducting of surveys of existing buildings and sample collection. The sample analysis, identification and quantification of asbestos contamination in bulk or air samples, on site or in the laboratory, shall also be performed. Inspections, analysis, identification and quantification of asbestos work shall be conducted utilizing and complying with OSHA, MIOSHA, NIOSHA, MDPH, and EPA approved methods.

- F. The Consultant shall be responsible for preparing or causing to have prepared the following reports for approval by the Genesee County Metropolitan Planning Commission:
- Risk Assessment
 - Lead Inspection
 - Combination Lead Inspection/Risk Assessment
 - Clearance
 - Asbestos Inspection
 - Asbestos Clearance
- G. The Contractor shall be responsible for supplying all labor, material, equipment, services, insurance, bonds, and all incidentals which are necessary or required to perform the work in accordance with applicable regulations and these specifications.
- H. The Contractor shall assume full responsibility and liability for the compliance with all Federal, State, regional, and local regulations pertaining to work practices, confined spaces, hauling, disposal, and protection of workers and visitors to the site. This shall include Hazard Communication to workers and visitors of the work site (29 CFR 1926.59).
- I. It shall be the Contractor's responsibility to assure that the inspections are conducted by persons certified in the State of Michigan and certified by the Michigan Department of Lead Hazard Remediation Program (LHRP), knowledgeable, qualified, and trained in asbestos, lead-based paint, and hazardous materials identification and sampling. Such persons shall comply with the appropriate Federal, State, and local regulations that mandate work practices and shall be capable of performing the work under this contract.

The work to be performed under the contract is subject to the requirements of Section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (Section 3).
