

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES CONTRACT

This Contract for Professional Services (the “Contract”) is by and between the County of Genesee, a Michigan Municipal Corporation, whose principal place of business is located at 324 Saginaw Street, Flint, Michigan 48502 (the “County”), and the **Genesee County Association of Fire Chiefs, Michigan Association**, whose principal place of business is located at PO Box 90783, Burton, Michigan 48509-0783 (the “Contractor”) (the County and the Contractor together, the “Parties”).

1. Term

1.1 Initial Term

The initial term of this Contract commences on **January 1, 2026**, and shall be effective through **January 1, 2029** (the “Initial Term”).

1.2 *Prior Service*

The County agrees to pay invoices for services provided in 2024 and 2025, attached as Exhibit E, during the time that the Contractor was responding to incidents involving hazardous materials, such as chemical spills, gas leaks, and radiological incidents

1.3 Extension Terms

The County has the option to extend this Contract for up to three (3) additional one-year terms (the “Extension Terms”).

2. Scope of Work

The Contractor agrees to perform the services described on Exhibit A (the “Services”).

3. Compensation

Budget Reimbursement. The County will reimburse the Contractor for the approved expenses incurred by the Contractor in the performance of this Contract ***from the fund that the County has accumulated as a result of collections from parties responsible for the hazardous spills.*** The total amount paid to the Contractor under this Contract, ***including the invoices from 2024 and 2025***, shall not exceed \$ 66,774.92 ***plus any interest collected on the above referenced fund.*** The Contractor’s projected budget for the Initial Term of this Contract is attached as Exhibit B (the “Budget”). If this Contract is extended, the County and the Contractor will agree in writing on a projected Budget for each Extension Term prior to the effective date of any Extension Term.

In addition, the County agrees to sell, and Contractor agrees to purchase, the vehicles identified on Exhibit C (the “Bill of Sale”). For and in consideration of a

total purchase price of \$1.00 and the Contractor's assumption of all liability and responsibility for operating the Genesee County Hazardous Materials Response Team in accordance with local, state, and federal law and regulations.

4. Delivery

The Purchaser is responsible for arranging for transportation of the vehicles. The Purchaser takes, title, ownership, and all responsibility for damage to the vehicles when the Purchaser or the Purchaser's agent takes possession of the vehicles upon execution of the Bill of Sale attached hereto as Exhibit C.

5. As-is No Warranty

The Purchaser has inspected the vehicles and acknowledges that the vehicles are sold "as is" and "with all faults." The County expressly disclaims all warranties with regard to the condition of the vehicles, including any warranties that the vehicles are merchantable or fit for a particular purpose. Purchaser agrees to indemnify and hold the County, its officials, officers, agents, and employees harmless from any and all claims, damages, or liability arising from the purchase, transportation, sale, or use of the vehicle by any person after the Purchaser takes title to the vehicles. Purchaser also agrees to agree to and execute the Release of Liability attached hereto as Exhibit D.

6. Taxes. The County is a Michigan Municipal Corporation. The Contractor acknowledges that the County is exempt from Federal Excise Tax and Michigan Sales Tax.

7. Contract Administrator

The contract administrator for this Contract is **Christopher R. Metropoulos, PEM, Office of the Genesee County Sheriff, Emergency Manager** (the "Contract Administrator"). The Contractor acknowledges that the Contract Administrator is the primary County contact for notices and instructions related to this Contract. The Contractor agrees to provide a copy of all notices related to this Contract to the Contract Administrator.

8. Warranties

The Contractor warrants that:

- 8.1 The Services will be performed in a good and workmanlike manner and in accordance with generally acceptable practices in the industry.
- 8.2 The Contractor will comply with all federal, state, and local laws in the performance of the Services.
- 8.3 The Contractor will comply with the requirements of any federal or state grants used to fund or support this Contract.

- 8.4 The Contractor will obtain and maintain all applicable licenses and permits necessary to provide the Services for the entire term of this Contract.

9. Suspension of Work

9.1 Order to Suspend Performance

Upon written order of the Contract Administrator, the Contractor agrees to immediately suspend performance of the Services pending an appeal to a neutral body comprised of three (3) mutually agreed upon individuals with knowledge of the subject matter that caused the suspension (“Appeal Panel”). The decision of the Appeal Panel shall be binding and not subject to review. The Contract Administrator shall escrow any compensation due to the Contractor during the suspension. If the Appeal Panel determines that the County Administrator improperly suspended the Services of the Contractor, the County Administrator shall within thirty (30) days release the escrowed compensation to the Contractor. If the Appeal Panel determines that the County Administrator acted properly, then the Contractor shall not be entitled to compensation for any Services performed during any period in which the Contract Administrator has directed that the Services be suspended.

9.2 Necessary Actions Before Suspension

As a condition precedent to the suspension of Services by the Contract Administrator, the Contract Administrator shall provide written notice to the Contractor of said suspension and the effective date of the suspension that shall be no earlier than the date of receipt of the notice by the Contractor. If the County Administrator suspends the Services of the Contractor, the Contractor shall be under no obligation to perform any Services pursuant to this Contract. If Contractor sua sponte provides Services pursuant to this Contract during the term of the suspension, Contractor acknowledges that it will not receive compensation unless the Appeal Panel rules in the Contractor’s favor.

If immediate suspension of the Services would cause harm, injury, or damage to persons or property, the Contractor must immediately notify the Contract Administrator of the nature of such harm, injury, or damage, and obtain written authorization from the Contract Administrator to take such necessary action as to prevent or minimize such harm, injury or damage.

10. Termination

10.1 Termination for Cause

Subject to Force Majeure as set forth in Section 17.11 of this Contract, if the Contractor is in breach of any provision of this Contract, and such breach

continues for fourteen (14) days after written notice is issued and provided to the Contractor by the County pursuant to Section 17.12 of this Contract, the County may terminate this Contract. Such termination for cause is effective upon receipt of the notice of termination by the Contractor.

In addition to any other remedies provided by law or this Contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the County as a result of the Contractor's breach and termination.

10.2 Immediate Termination

If the County, in its discretion, determines that the Contractor's breach of this Contract constitutes a threat to public health, safety, or welfare, the County may terminate this Contract immediately upon written notice to the Contractor.

In addition to any other remedies provided by law or this Contract, the Contractor shall be responsible for all costs incurred by the County as a result of the Contractor's breach and termination.

10.3 Termination for Convenience

If the County determines that it is in the County's best interests, the County may terminate this Contract upon thirty (30) days' written notice to the Contractor.

The County shall pay for all work properly performed up to the effective date of the notice of termination.

10.4 Termination for Lack of Funding

If this Contract is funded by public funds or a grant from a public or private entity, and the funds are not appropriated or the grant is discontinued, the County may terminate this Contract by written notice specifying the date of termination.

The County shall pay for all work properly performed up to the effective date of the notice of termination.

11. Nondiscrimination

The Contractor covenants that it will not discriminate against an employee or applicant of employment with respect to hire, tenure, terms, conditions, or privileges of employment, or a matter directly or indirectly related to employment, because of race, color, religion, national origin, age, sex, sexual identity, gender, gender identity, gender expression, height, weight, marital status, or a disability that is unrelated to the individual's ability to perform the duties of a particular job or position, and that it will require the same non-discrimination assurances from

any subcontractor who may be used to carry out duties described in this contract. Contractor covenants that it will not discriminate against businesses that are owned by women, minorities or persons with disabilities in providing services covered by this Contract, and that it shall require the same assurances from subcontractors. Breach of this covenant shall be regarded as a material breach of this contract.

12. Freedom of Information Act

This Contract and all attachments, as well as any other information submitted by the Contractor to the County, are subject to disclosure under the provisions of 1976 PA 442, being MCL § 15.231, *et seq.*, known as the "Freedom of Information Act".

13. Audit Rights

13.1 Certification of Accurate Information

Contractor certifies that all information provided to the County by the Contractor relating to the award or modification of this Contract, or any payment or dispute related to this Contract, is true and correct. The Contractor further certifies that its accounting system conforms to generally accepted accounting principles.

13.2 Inspection

The Contractor agrees that the County may inspect the Contractor's plant, place of business, or worksite to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract. If this Contract is funded or supported with any state or federal grant funds, the state or federal agencies responsible for administering the applicable grants may examine the Contractor's plant, place of business, or worksite to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract and the terms of the applicable grant.

13.3 Audit

The Contractor agrees that the County may examine the Contractor's records to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract. If this Contract is funded or supported with any state or federal grant funds, the state or federal agencies responsible for administering the applicable grants may examine the Contractor's records to ensure compliance with the terms of this Contract and the terms of the applicable grant.

13.4 Records Retention

The Contractor agrees to maintain any business records related to this Contract or the Contractor's performance under this Contract for a period of at least three (3) years after final payment.

14. Identity Theft Prevention

14.1 In the event that the Contractor obtains identifying information during the performance of the Services, the Contractor must take reasonable precautions to ensure that such identifying information is protected from unauthorized disclosure and is used only for the purpose of performing the Services.

14.2 For the purposes of this Paragraph, "identifying information" means any name or number that may be used, alone or in conjunction with any other information, to identify a specific person, including but not limited to name, address, telephone number, social security number, date of birth, driver's license number, taxpayer identification number, or routing code.

15. Insurance Requirements and Indemnification

The Contractor shall at all times maintain in full force and effect for duration of the term of this agreement the following insurance coverages. All coverage shall be with insurance companies licensed and admitted to do business in the State of Michigan, having an AM Best rating of at least A- and acceptable to Genesee County. *In addition, the County reserves the right to modify or waive at any time any applicable insurance requirements based on the scope of services provided at the discretion of the County's Risk Manager or other authorized representatives of the County.*

Commercial General Liability Insurance on an "occurrence basis" with minimum limits of \$ 1,000,000 per occurrence and a \$ 2,000,000 aggregate limit.-. The policy shall name Genesee County, including all employees, elected and appointed officials and volunteers, all boards, commissions, and/or authorities, and their board members, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds. Coverage shall be primary and non-contributory, including a waiver of subrogation in favor of the County.

Workers' Compensation Insurance – as required by and in accordance with all applicable statutes of the State of Michigan, including Employers' Liability Coverage.

Automobile Liability – Including Michigan No-Fault coverages, with limits of liability not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence combined single limit for bodily injury and property damage. Coverage shall include all owned, non-owned, and hired vehicles. Limits may be satisfied using primary and excess/umbrella liability policies. -. The policy shall name Genesee County, including all employees, elected and appointed officials and volunteers, all boards, commissions, and/or authorities, and their board members, employees, and volunteers as additional insureds.

Professional Liability Insurance – in an amount not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 aggregate. If this policy is a claims made form, the

Contractor shall be required to keep said policy in force, or purchase "tail" coverage for a minimum of three (3) years after the termination of this contract.

A licensee or its insurance broker shall notify the County of any cancellation or reduction in coverage within seven (7) days of receipt of insurer's notification to that effect. The contractor, licensee, permittee, or lessee shall forthwith obtain and submit proof of substitute insurance to the County Risk Manager within five (5) business days in the event of expiration or cancellation of coverage.

15.1 Insurance Certificate and Additional Insured Coverage

- 1. Certificate of Insurance** – The contractor must provide a Certificate of Insurance evidencing the required insurance set forth above. The Certificate Holder should be listed as follows:

- 2. Endorsements** In addition, the contractor must provide the following endorsements, including but not limited to:

- a. An additional insured endorsement (equivalent in coverage to ISO form CG 20 10 and CG 20 37) naming the "Genesee County, its officials, employees and agents, all boards, commissions and/or authorities and board members, including employees and volunteers thereof" as additional insureds under the general liability policy. No person or department should be identified as the additional insured. Coverage afforded shall be considered primary and any other insurance or self-insurance, maintained by or available to the County shall be considered secondary and/or excess.
- b. An endorsement to each policy stating that such policy shall not be cancelled or reduced in coverage except after thirty (30) days prior written notice to County. Cancellation, material restriction, nonrenewal or lapse of any of the required policies shall be grounds for immediate termination of the Agreement by the County. If any of the required coverages expire during the term of the contract, the vendor shall deliver renewal certificates, endorsements, and/or policies to County at least ten (10) days prior to the expiration date.

In lieu of required endorsements, a copy of the policy sections, where coverage is provided for additional insured and cancellation notice, may be acceptable. Copies of all policies mentioned above shall be furnished, if so requested.

15.2 Indemnification

To the extent permitted by law, each party will remain responsible only for its own acts and omissions and the acts and omissions of its employees, officers, directors, and affiliates. A party shall not be liable for any claims, demands, actions, costs, expenses, and liabilities, including reasonable attorneys' fees, which may arise in connection with the failure of the other party or its employees, officers, directors, or agents to perform any of their obligations under this Agreement.

16. Independent Contractor

The Contractor and its agents and employees are independent contractors and are not the employees of the County.

17. General Provisions

17.1 Entire Contract

This Contract, consisting of the following documents and exhibits, embodies the entire Contract between the Parties.

17.1.1. The Contract – This Professional Services Contract

17.1.2. Exhibit A – The Scope of Work

17.1.3. Exhibit B – Budget

17.1.4. Exhibit C – Transfer of hazardous waste team vehicles bill of sale

17.1.5. Exhibit D -- Release of Liability

17.1.6. Exhibit E -- Invoices from 2024 and 2025

17.2 No Assignment

The Contractor may not assign or subcontract this Contract without the express written consent of the County.

17.3 Modification

This Contract may be modified only in writing executed with the same formalities as this Contract.

17.4 Binding Effect

The provisions of this Contract shall apply to and bind the heirs, executors, administrators, and assigns all of the parties hereto.

17.5 Headings

The paragraph headings in this Contract are used only for ease of reference, and do not limit, modify, construe, and or interpret any provision of this Contract.

17.6 Governing Law and Venue

This Contract is entered into under the laws of the State of Michigan. Any litigation between the Parties arising out of this Contract must be initiated within two years of the cause of action accruing and must be brought in a court of competent jurisdiction in Genesee County, Michigan.

17.7 Subpoena Power

The Contractor acknowledges and understands that the Chairperson of the Genesee County Board of Commissioners, pursuant to MCL 46.3(5), as amended, has the power to administer oaths, issue subpoenas, and compel a person's attendance in the same manner as a court of law. The Contractor agrees to submit to this power with respect to this Contract.

17.8 Severability and Survival

In the event that any provision of this Contract is deemed by any court of competent jurisdiction to be legally ineffective, such decision shall have no effect on the remaining provisions of this Contract.

17.9 Interpretation

Each Party has had opportunity to have this Contract reviewed by legal counsel and has had equal opportunity to contribute to its contents. In the event of any dispute concerning the interpretation of this Contract, there shall be no presumption in favor of any interpretation solely because the form of this Contract was prepared by the County.

17.10 Remedies

All remedies specified in this Contract are non-exclusive. The County reserves the right to seek any and all remedies available under this Contract

and applicable law in the event that the Contractor fails to abide by the terms of this Contract.

17.11 Force Majeure

If by reason of Force Majeure either party hereto shall be rendered unable wholly or in part to carry out its obligations under this Contract, other than the obligation of the County to make the payments required under this Contract, then such party shall give notice and full particulars of such force majeure in writing to the other party within a reasonable time after occurrence of the event or cause relied on, the obligation of the party giving such notice, so far as it is affected by such Force Majeure, shall be suspended during the continuance of the inability then claimed, but for no longer period, and any such party shall endeavor to remove or overcome such inability with all reasonable dispatch. If the event results in an insurance claim and settlement are authorized, the settlement proceeds shall be in the name of the County and the name of the Contractor. The County and the Contractor shall mutually determine if the County, the Contractor, or both shall be entitled to a share of the insurance proceeds.

The term "Force Majeure" as employed herein shall mean acts of God, strikes, lockouts or other industrial disturbances, acts of public enemy, orders of any kind of the Government of the United States or the State, or any civil or military authority, insurrection, riots, pandemics, epidemics, endemic, landslides, lightning, earthquake, fires, hurricanes, storms, floods, washouts, droughts, arrests, restraint of government and people, civil disturbances, explosions, breakage or accidents to machinery, pipelines or canals, or on account of any other causes not reasonably within the control of the party claiming such inability.

17.12 Notice

Addresses and Notice. Unless otherwise provided herein and except for invoices, any other notice, communication, request, reply or advice (herein severally and collectively, for convenience, called "Notice") herein provided or permitted to be given, made or accepted by any party to any other party must be in writing and may be given or be served by **email and** depositing the same in the United States mail postpaid and registered or certified and addressed to the party to be notified, with return receipt requested, or by delivering the same to an officer of such party, addressed to the party to be notified. Notice deposited in the mail in the manner described above shall be conclusively deemed to be effective, unless otherwise stated herein, from and after the expiration of three (3) days after it is so deposited. Notice given in any other manner shall be effective only if and when received by the party to be notified. For the purposes of notice, the addresses of the parties shall, until changed as hereinafter provided, be as follows:

EXHIBIT A

Scope of the Services

The Genesee County Hazmat Team will respond to incidents involving hazardous materials, such as chemical spills, gas leaks, and radiological incidents. The primary goal is to contain and control the release of hazardous substances to protect public health and the environment. The Hazmat Team will assess each situation to identify the hazardous materials involved.

Once identified, the team will work to contain and mitigate the release. This may involve sealing leaks, neutralizing chemicals, or using absorbent materials to control spills. The Hazmat Teams goal is to minimize the environmental impact of hazardous materials incidents.

The Genesee County Fire Chiefs will attempt to recover the costs of the incident by submitting claims to the parties responsible.

Additionally, the Genesee County Fire Chiefs ensures that the Hazmat Team's apparatus, equipment, and supplies needed for responding to hazardous material incidents are properly maintained.

The Genesee County Fire Chief also agree to be listed as the primary response team for the Genesee County Water and Waste Department with two sites in Genesee County and one in Lapeer County.

Insurance - \$484.00 every other month (6 Payments) (35% of Premium) = \$2,904.00 Annually

Gas & Oil - \$100.00 average per month (12 Months) = \$1,200.00 Annually

Vehicle Maintenance - \$296.24 (Yearly DOT of 4 Units such as CBRNE, City Truck, HAZMAT Trailer, & CBRNE Trailer) = \$1,184.00 Annually

Vehicle Maintenance – Repairs made to keep apparatuses safe for use (Average Yearly Repairs of 4 Units such as CBRNE, City Truck, HAZMAT Trailer, & CBRNE Trailer) = \$1,200.00 Annually

Communications – Accountability App (Currently Active911), antennas, batteries, & programming. = \$1,000.00 Annually

Training - \$40 per Member (20 Roster Max for 8-hour /HAZMAT Refresher annually) = \$800.00 Annually

Training - \$155 per Member (20 Roster Max for 24 HAZMAT Training) = \$3,100.00 Annually
